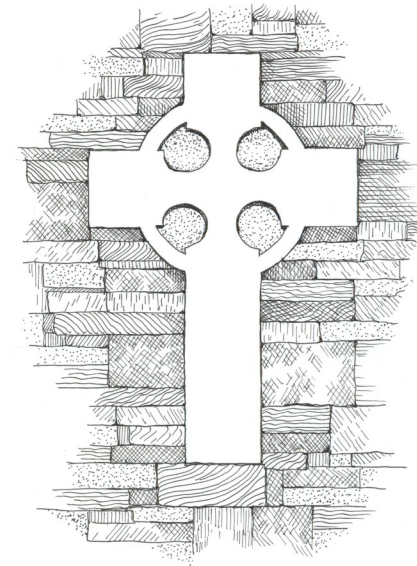

NEW ZEALAND

Recently, Campus Outreach Dunedin along with Campus Outreach Christchurch cohosted their annual Winter Conference (Southern Hemisphere). After months of restrictions, students rejoiced to join in-person to learn about God's holiness from a series of speakers.

Dunedin Ministry Director David Richards shared:

“In our last update I asked you to pray that 70 people would come to Winter Conference, so praise be to God for answering your prayers! This meant a blend of students, young workers and staff from at least five different churches on the South Island.” In a nation that is characterized by a largely cynical and agnostic view of faith, this type of turnout to engage with the Bible and the gospel is thrilling. Students gathered in New Zealand to study the Bible together. For many, this is the first time they have ever engaged with God's Word directly.

THAILAND

As students returned to campus in Thailand, Campus Outreach staff at Chiang Mai University hosted a welcome back event. 60 students who had been isolated for months gathered to meet student leaders and staff.

Asia Network Director Brian Firpo said:

“The Chiang Mai University team was blown away with the response to our Welcome Back party last week—sixty students showed up, many whom we had only just met. And our campus director at Mae Jo University had to reserve two fields the first week he hosted football (soccer) because there was an overwhelming response to guys signing up to play.” Imagine all of the new friendships and conversations leading to Jesus that will be coming out of all this.

Whether meeting in person or online, God is working through Campus Outreach student leaders and staff. We've been amazed by the number of students He is drawing as restrictions lift. Many of these young men and women are not only new to this community of believers, but they have never heard the gospel before.

Thank you for continuing to pray and partner with us as we seek to build a new generation of laborers for Christ. God is faithfully using your partnership to impact the college campus, gateway cities, and the global church around the world.
